However, Silent Spring came several years after Carson garnered acclaim for other works, including Under the Sea-Wind and The Sea Around Us. Under the Sea-Wind was Carson's first book. Although it struggled to gain attention when it was first published due to the onset of World War II, Under the Sea-Wind eventually made the New York Times best-seller list.

Under the Sea-Wind was in the works since 1937 when Carson's essay Undersea, published by Atlantic Monthly, caught the attention of Simon & Schuster who suggested she expand it into a book. Undersea is a narrative about the creatures on the ocean floor.
